- 60% of first time, full-time students in Wyoming are enrolled in the community colleges (source: NCES IPEDS, Fall 2014 data).

- Students won't come, let alone stay, if you put up barriers.




# Educational Attainment (2015)

US Overall – 15.07%


Wyoming CC's – 17.01%

### Success After Transfer


- •59% of Wyoming CC Transfers to UW with 30 credits earn a Bachelor's degree four years after transfer.
- •63% of Wyoming CC Transfers who enter UW with 60 credits earn Bachelor's degree four years after transfer.

# Transfer to UW is Going the Wrong Way


Figure 1. Headcount of Wyoming Community College Transfers

#### Wyoming GDP by Industry (2014)




#### Top Industry Sectors; Job Postings over the Past Year





#### Top Detailed O\*NET Occupations; Job Postings over the Past Year




#### Top Burning Glass Occupations (BGTOCCs); Job Postings over the Past Year



#### **WY CC Degree Production (2015)**




#### **UWYO Degree Production (2015)**






## WY's population isn't growing much.
